

### PROMULGATION STATEMENT

Emergency Support Function (ESF) #8 – Public Health and Medical Services provides the mechanism for public health agencies within Kentucky and Tennessee to effectively coordinate preparedness, response, and recovery activities to any all-hazards event that may affect the health and safety of people residing in either state. As a result, the Kentucky/Tennessee Planning Coalition has developed this All Hazards Cross-Border Notification Plan which details how public health agencies at the local, district/region, state, and federal level will alert, notify, and share incident related information before, during, and after an incident occurs.

Key personnel identified in this plan are responsible for public health and medical preparedness and will coordinate response and recovery activities in their respective jurisdiction through coordination with applicable local, district/region, state, and federal agencies.

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### **Overview**

### <u>Purpose</u>

The purpose of this plan is to establish triggers and mechanisms for alerting and sharing information between local, district/region, state, and federal public health agencies due to any all hazards event that may affect neighboring regions within Kentucky (KY) and Tennessee (TN). This includes, but is not limited to, natural and man-made incidents, communicable disease outbreaks, hazardous materials (HazMat) incidents, radiological incidents, and animal and plant disease outbreaks.

This document addresses mechanisms and processes for alerting and sharing of information between public health agencies and does not address the specifics of technical interoperability of jurisdictional communication systems.

It is recognized that information sharing during an emergency or disaster may take a somewhat adapted flow and format to assure alignment with existing jurisdictional emergency operations plans and incident protocols.

### **Scope**

This document applies to the Kentucky Department for Public Health (KDPH), Tennessee Department of Health (TDH), and the local public health agencies in the counties, districts, and regions that border KY and TN. <a href="Attachment 1">Attachment 1</a> contains a map showing the location of KY and TN bordering county health departments and state health departments. The Department of Health and Human Services' (DHHS) Office of the Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response (ASPR) provides a coordination role for Region IV states.

### **Planning Assumptions**

Information sharing needs to be timely and appropriate to the situation.

Incident based information sharing processes between the two states should utilize existing communication systems, incident management software systems (e.g., WebEOC, Health Alert Network (HAN)) and processes (e.g. Incident Action Plans, Situation Reports) and not require creation of additional materials or systems to create a common operating picture.

While processes outlined here are mutually agreed upon as useful and desirable practices, they are not binding nor meant in any way to intrude upon the sovereignty or autonomy of individual jurisdictions.

Other regional communication networks may exist and provide for additional channels of communication, (e.g. State Health Officer to State Health Officer).





In a disaster or incident, all information flow should be in accordance with existing state emergency operations plans and be coordinated with emergency management agencies where applicable.

It is understood that some information may be considered sensitive and/or be prohibited from being shared due to individual state and local policies or directives.

Choice of methods for information sharing should be flexible to account for jurisdictional differences and for variations in severity of incidents.

### **Triggers for Alerting**

Public health agencies within KY and TN will notify the appropriate agency(s) whenever any of the following triggers occur that have the potential to involve a neighboring county, district/region, or state:

- 1. Activation of Emergency Support Function (ESF) #8: Whenever KY's or TN's ESF #8 Public Health and Medical Services system is activated at the local, district/region, or state level due to any natural or man-made incident. This includes, but is not limited to:
  - a. <u>Natural Incidents</u>: Animal/plant disease outbreaks, disease outbreaks, droughts, earthquakes, flooding, landslides, severe weather, tornadoes, or wildfires.
  - b. <u>Man-made Incidents</u>: Hazardous material incidents, industrial accidents, radiological incidents, riots, terrorism (chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, explosive (CBRNE) incidents), or transportation accidents.
  - c. <u>Health and Medical Systems</u>: Any incident that may impact the public health or medical system of the adjacent state (e.g. interstate patient movement, citizens crossing state borders for prophylaxis or treatment, surge on bordering healthcare facilities, travel restrictions/recommendations, or closing of schools due to disease outbreaks).
  - d. <u>CHEMPACK Deployment</u>: Any incident requiring the cross-border deployment of CHEMPACK assets.

### 2. Communicable Disease Outbreaks

a. Surveillance systems show an unusually high number of suspected or confirmed cases of reportable diseases that may pose a significant threat to either state.

- b. An outbreak, epidemic, related public health hazard, or suspected/confirmed act of bioterrorism.
- c. Unexpected pattern of suspected or confirmed cases of diseases or deaths which may indicate a newly recognized infectious agent.
- d. An unusually high number of cases that may trigger an informational alert.
- e. Increase or decrease in the number of persons in isolation or quarantine.
- f. Likelihood of public/media inquiry related to a disease outbreak.

### 3. Hazardous Materials (HazMat) Incidents

- a. An incident where hazardous materials are involved with the potential to impact another jurisdiction:
  - A transportation incident occurs that involves hazardous materials.
  - Activation of a HazMat Team.
  - HazMat plume may affect an area in the neighboring state.
  - Large numbers of ill persons or animals with unexplained source of illness.
- b. Likelihood of public/media inquiry related to a HazMat issue.

### 4. Radiological Incidents

- a. An incident in which radiological materials are involved and in which one of the following has occurred:
  - An entity that deals with radiological materials reports an issue that requires coordination of response activities.
  - Non-planned nuclear release, reactor meltdown, or core breach.





- A transportation incident occurs that involves radiological materials that have the potential of affecting an area in the neighboring state.
- b. Effects of a radiological incident that may impact the public health or medical system of the adjacent state.
- c. Likelihood of public/media inquiry related to a radiological incident.

### 5. Animal and Plant Disease Outbreaks

- a. Any incident in which ESF #11 Agriculture and Natural Resources is involved that has the potential to impact the human population in the adjacent state to include:
  - An outbreak of a highly contagious animal/zoonotic disease.
  - An outbreak of an economically significant plant pest or disease.
- b. Likelihood of public/media inquiry related to incidents involving animal or plant related diseases.

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### **CONCEPT OF OPERATIONS**

### General

- Information Flow: The KY/TN All Hazards Information Sharing Diagram in <u>Attachment 2</u> shows how information should be disseminated between local, district/region, state, and federal agencies as outlined in this plan. This diagram should be referenced throughout the information sharing process.
- Contact Information: <u>Attachments 3 through 11</u> contain the contact information for key personnel from local, district/region, state, and federal agencies for this plan.

### **Preparedness**

- 1. KY and TN State Departments of Health shall maintain the following:
  - a. 24/7 notification capabilities.
  - b. Accurate contact lists.
  - c. Interoperable Communication Systems.
  - d. Incident management software systems to include HAN, ReadyOp and WebEOC.
- 2. Each state will maintain the following 24 Hour Warning Points:
  - a. Kentucky
    - Division of Emergency Management's Duty Officer
    - KDPH's On-Call Epidemiologist
  - b. Tennessee
    - Emergency Management Agency's State EOC Duty Officer
    - TN Department of Health's Emergency Services Coordinator(s)
- 3. Personnel from KY's and TN's local, district/region, and state public health agencies shall participate in training and exercises that focus on notification and information sharing processes as outlined in this plan.





### **Response**

- 1. ESF #8 Public Health and Medical Services will be placed on standby or activated upon notification of an emergency or disaster. When ESF #8 is activated, the assigned ESF #8 Liaison for each state will implement procedures to notify and share information with the applicable agencies as listed in this plan.
- 2. Throughout an incident, all agencies shall:
  - a. Share information horizontally and vertically following inter- and intrastate processes through the use of available communication and incident management software systems.
  - b. Maintain situational awareness.
  - c. Report and disseminate incident related information.
  - d. Provide information that will enable each agency to plan and respond appropriately within their jurisdiction.
  - e. Request assistance as appropriate.
- 3. <u>Local Jurisdiction</u>: When a local jurisdiction is threatened by, or has been impacted by, an emergency or disaster that may affect a neighboring jurisdiction, local public health agencies shall promptly share incident related information regardless of county or state borders. At minimum, affected local public health agencies will notify the following, as applicable, by the quickest means possible.
  - a. Local Public Health
    - Heath Department Directors
    - Environmental Health Directors
    - Regional Epidemiologists
    - Public Health Preparedness Personnel
    - KY's Regional Preparedness Coordinators
    - TN's Emergency Response Coordinators
    - Healthcare Preparedness Coordinators





- County Emergency Management Officials
- b. Respective State Department of Health
  - State Health Officer
  - State Epidemiologist
  - Preparedness Program Manager
- 1. <u>State Department of Health</u>: Upon receiving notification from affected areas, the cognizant state Department of Health shall gather incident related information from the affected jurisdiction and promptly disseminate information to the following, as applicable, by the quickest means possible.
  - a. Bordering State Department of Health
    - State Health Officer
    - State Epidemiologist
    - Preparedness Program Manager
  - b. Respective State Regional Coordinators
    - TN's Emergency Response Coordinators
    - KY's Regional Preparedness Coordinators
    - TN's Regional Hospital Coordinators
    - KY's Healthcare Preparedness Coordinators
  - c. Respective State Emergency Management Agency
    - Emergency Management Duty Officer
  - d. Respective Local Public Health Agency (that may be affected by the incident)
    - Heath Department Directors
    - Environmental Health Director

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- Regional Epidemiologists
- Public Health Preparedness Personnel
- e. <u>Department of Health and Human Services' (HHS) Office of the Assistant</u> Secretary for Preparedness & Response (ASPR)
  - HHS's Region IV ASPR Office
  - HHS Region IV Regional Emergency Coordinator
  - HHS Region IV Field Project Officer (Hospital Preparedness Program)
- f. Other state and county agencies, as applicable.
- Department of Health and Human Services: Upon notification from the affected state, the DHHS' Region IV Regional Emergency Coordinator(s)/Field Project Officer(s) shall work with the ESF #8 leads in each state to disseminate incident related information and coordinate federal support for an emergency response, as applicable.
- 3. Type of Information
  - a. Incident related information shall be disseminated using the Public Health Cross-Border Incident Notification Report contained in <u>Attachment 12</u> as required by the Information Collection, Analysis, and Dissemination Section of this plan.
  - b. At a minimum, the following will be reported:
    - Reporting Agency
    - Type of incident
    - Location of incident (to include possible area of impact)
    - Number of people affected
    - · Request for public health and medical assistance; if required

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### **Deactivation**

- Public health agencies within KY and TN shall coordinate with each other to determine when incident operations will be deactivated and when information sharing processes will cease. Upon the decision to deactivate operations, all agencies shall be notified through the use of HAN, E-mail, or other information sharing processes.
- 2. Public health agencies within KY and TN shall evaluate and document response and recovery activities through After Action Reviews and After Action Reports/Improvement Plans (AAR/IP). Key problems and corrective actions shall be identified, implemented, and tracked as applicable.

### **RESPONSIBILITIES**

- 1. All agencies shall train personnel on this plan and provide updates when changes occur.
- 2. All agencies shall participate in exercises that focus on notification and information sharing processes as outlined in this plan.
- 3. Designated personnel shall maintain an up-to-date account in KY's and TN's HAN systems. Personnel shall know how to send and confirm alerts via these systems.
- 4. All agencies shall maintain current contact lists and ensure applicable personnel are provided the most current copy.
- 5. Local and state public health agencies within KY and TN shall follow the processes as outlined in this plan to ensure rapid notification and continued information sharing for any all-hazards incident.
- 6. All agencies shall pass information through their chain of command as appropriate.

### INFORMATION COLLECTION, ANALYSIS, AND DISSEMINATION

 Public health agencies within KY and TN shall gather, analyze, and disseminate incident related information through coordination with the respective local health jurisdiction (county, district, and region), adjacent state, and federal agencies. This may be accomplished through the use of primary and redundant communication systems and incident management software systems including Epi-X, HAN, ReadyOp and WebEOC.





- 2. Each state will use its own pre-developed forms for alerts, i.e., Incident Action Plans (IAP) and Situation Reports (SitRep). SitReps will be shared between public health agencies upon activation of this plan.
- 3. Confidentiality and legal restraints shall be considered throughout the information sharing process.
- 4. Personal information deemed "close hold not for further dissemination" shall not be included in SitReps or IAPs and shall not be disseminated via E-mail, HAN, ReadyOp or WebEOC unless it is edited to remove any sensitive information, i.e., information protected under the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA).

### COMMUNICATIONS

- 1. Local and state public health agencies within KY and TN shall use communication systems to maintain connectivity with local, state, federal, and private agencies. Primary communications systems that can be used include land-based telephone systems, cellular telephones, E-mail, internet, facsimile, and two-way radio in both the VHF and 800MHz frequency bands. Redundant communication systems include satellite radio and telephone, amateur radio, high frequency radio, and video conferencing. Incident management software systems include HAN, ReadyOp, and WebEOC.
- State Health Alert Network (HAN) Systems: Designated personnel from local, district/region, state, and federal public health agencies shall be entered into the appropriate Roles or Role Groups in KY's ReadyOp and TN's HAN systems. ReadyOp and HAN systems shall be used to alert designated personnel and to share incident related information.

### PLAN DEVELOPMENT AND MAINTENANCE

### <u>Maintenance</u>

The KY/TN Unified Planning Coalition shall conduct an annual review of the KY/TN All Hazards Cross-Border Notification Plan. Additional reviews may be conducted after an exercise or a significant incident occurs and/or if regulatory changes indicate a need. KDPH's ESF 8 Planning Coordinator shall track and distribute any changes to this plan using the document change record listed in the <a href="Record of Changes Section">Record of Changes Section</a> when revisions/updates are required outside the official review cycle.

Documentation of periodic/annual reviews and revisions to this plan shall be maintained on file by KDPH's ESF 8 Planning Coordinator. Documentation should include, at a minimum, the date of the change, a description of the change with page/section number, and the name and title of the person who made the change.





Elements of this plan shall be evaluated during scheduled exercises.

### **Document Control**

The KY/TN Cross-Border Notification Plan shall be distributed to all agencies identified within the plan. Copies of this plan may be distributed via hard copy, electronic copy, or by posting on internal websites.

KDPH's ESF 8 Planning Coordinator shall track who has received a copy of this plan and ensure updated versions are distributed whenever critical changes occur. The original, signed copy and digital copy of this plan shall be maintained by the KDPH ESF 8 Planning Coordinator.

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


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### **Attachment 1 – Map of Kentucky/Tennessee Bordering Public Health Departments**






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### Attachment 2 – Kentucky/Tennessee All Hazards Public Information Sharing Diagram

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

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


